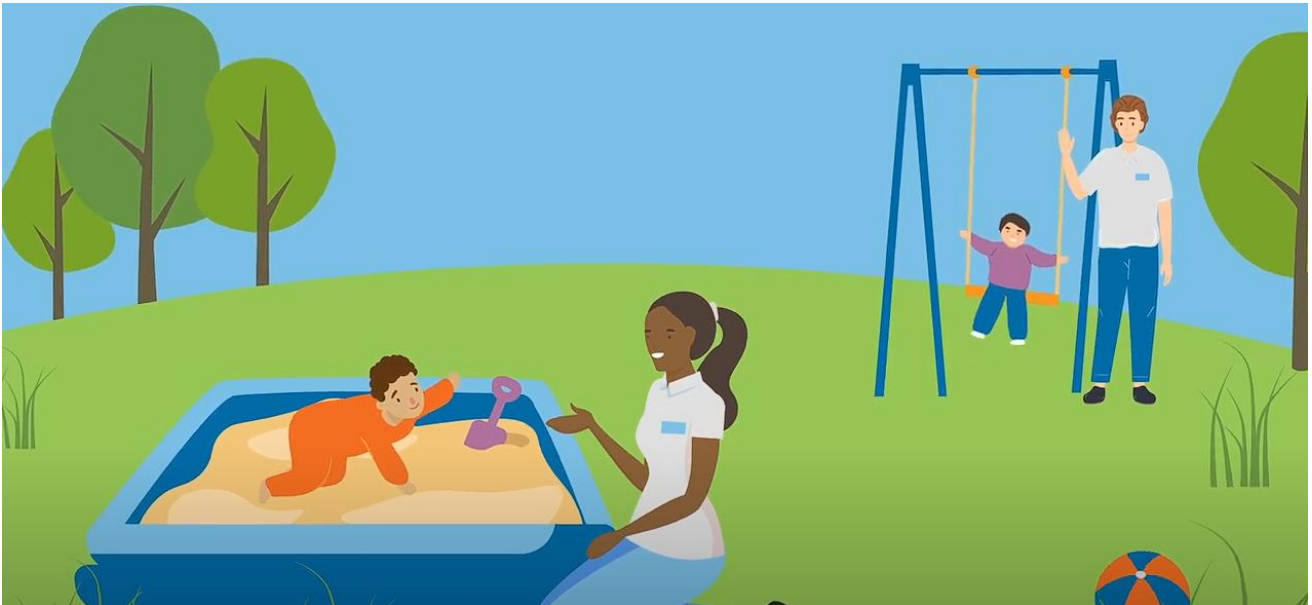

NSW Department of Education and SDN Children's Services Launch the Referrers Project to Support Families in Early Learning Enrolment

Sydney (26 March 2025) SDN Children's Services, is proud to announce the publication of the Referrers Project—an initiative designed to streamline the enrolment process for vulnerable families seeking early learning and preschool services in New South Wales.

Funded by a grant from the NSW Department of Education, the purpose of the tools is to build a bridge between referrers, centre staff and families, ensuring they are all on the same page about the steps a family needs to take when enrolling their child in early learning.

“The Referrers Project provides a structured, step-by-step roadmap to help families make informed decisions about their child's early education,” said Fernanda Brarda, SDN Customer Experience & Data Insights Specialist.

Simplified enrolment support

The Referrers Project is built around an enrolment checklist that guides families through five essential phases:



- **Prepare** – Gather necessary documents and determine eligibility for government funding.
- **Find** – Research early childhood education centres and schedule visits.
- **Visit** – Learn key questions to ask and understand the waiting list process.
- **Enrol** – Complete formal enrolment and apply for financial assistance.
- **Settle** – Support a smooth transition, including orientation sessions and early adjustment strategies.
